Old Testament Survey

The Prophetical Books

Isaiah

The prophetic books both foretell future events and forthtell messages for the current time period in which they lived. Often the message of the prophet had a twofold meaning. Such is the case in the book of Isaiah. Isaiah was a prophet in the period prior to the captivity in Assyria and directed his message to Judah (one of the two Jewish nations at the time).

Written under the Law, Isaiah gives the reader a clear view of grace and could be called the prophet of redemption. More than any other writer in the Old Testament, Isaiah describes the Messiah, Jesus Christ. The details of Christ's sufferings, His life, His trials and His crucifixion are given in a number of passages in Isaiah.

Isaiah was also used by God to warn the nation of coming judgment against them for their rebellion. In this we see the grace policy of God toward His chosen people Israel. The nation is always given ample warning before it is destroyed or conquered by opposing nations. Even when this occurs in the nation's history a remnant of faithful believers always remains.

Isaiah 7 introduces the righteous ruler Who will come in the future to deliver the nation from her enemies. Of course, most of the nation did not understand that this promise was for the future when Messiah comes to rule and reign upon the earth at the Second Coming. Isaiah 7:14, predicts the virgin birth of Christ more than 700 years before He was born. Isaiah 53 describes the life and death of Christ and much more:

When a nation fails to acknowledge or forgets to acknowledge the divine establishment principles from God, it will ultimately fail. A nation that acknowledges these principles will survive and freedom will be perpetuated. Such was the nation of Israel until they turned their backs on God and His principles of freedom.

Isaiah brought the news of impending judgment, but he also brought hope if the nation would return to obeying God. Even though a remnant of faithful believers remained, the number of these believers was not always sufficient to stop the discipline to the nation. The principle is that when there is a large enough "pivot" of faithful believers within a nation, God will often withhold His judgment. This was not the case during the life and ministry of Isaiah.
